

Choose your characters, the background, the thought or speech bubbles, and the number of panels, and get started! In addition, the creator has included 21 ways to use online comic making in the classroom, such as including creating autobiographical comics, practicing new vocabulary words, creating a daily diary, creating a serialized comic strip, perhaps using it at a family literacy night, or as a way for students to comment on national news stories. Foreign language students can also create comics in Spanish, French, German, Italian, Latin or Portuguese. The comic strips can be saved, printed and/or emailed. Most of all, creating comic strips are a great way to learn and have fun at the same time!
