As we all know, students should be reading non-fiction passages in addition to fiction. Why not have your students read newspaper articles to experience life outside of their hometown? A unique way to do this is to read newspaper articles on similar topics from newspapers from around the world. With thousands of newspapers available in hundreds of different languages, your students can find articles on almost any topic, from science in the news, to politics and current events. Most countries have at least one newspaper in English, so it is easy to experience other cultures, while reading in English.

An assignment about a different perhaps from states or five countries and contrast the interesting would be to read current event in newspapers, five different different compare and contents of the article. Is there a slant or prejudice shown in the article, depending on its origin? Which newspaper has the best writers? Do the articles answer "Who, what, when, where and why?" 


Kidtopia
