

Do you and your students love art, but you are too far away to visit an art museum? Why not visit an amazing online gallery of art? Our favorite "gallery" of art is the Web Gallery of Art. Available in both a desktop and mobile version, you can search by the artist's name, school of art (from American to Polish), period (from Medieval to Impressionism), timeline, or profession (Painter to Tapestry Weaver).

You can also take any of fifteen tours of famous artists or art locations such as Italian painters, the Sistine Chapel, or Women Artists. You can try a "dual mode" to compare artists and their work side by side. You can send an electronic postcard to a friend and include a fine work of art on the card. There is a glossary, and you can also listen to classical music while you explore the web site. This site is not just for art students and teachers! It's also for the rest of us who want to explore our artistic side too!
