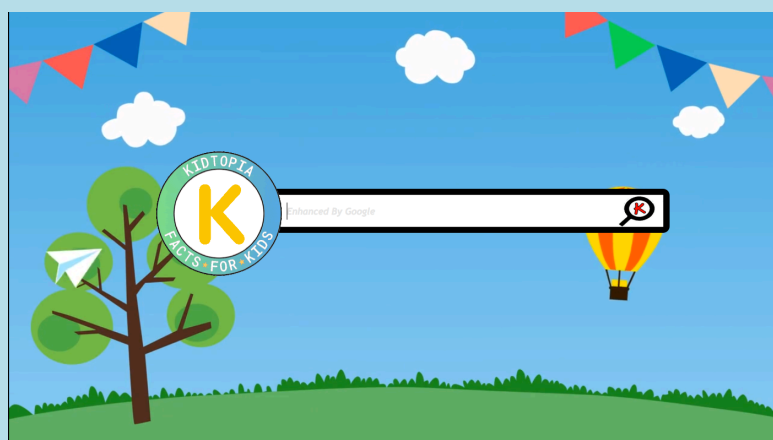

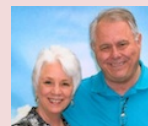

## Explore the Seasons and the Weather with Elementary Students

Via *Edutopia*, Kathy Y. Stovall recommends eight activities about weather and the seasons to ensure that students have a solid foundation to learn more complex scientific material.
