FOR ADULTS continued.....

- Join a book club in person or online. Better yet, create an in-person or online book club with friends. Many public libraries have sets of books set aside for this purpose.
- Sign up for the summer reading program for adults at your local public library. (They usually have prizes!)
- Sign up for a Reading Challenge on Goodreads.com (.....I plan to read 52 books in 2023 for my challenge.)
- Amazon has a list of recommended summer reading this year.

- Find a local used bookstore and buy some paperbacks for the summer. Your local library probably has used books for less than \$1. (Note: I actually volunteer at our local library's bookstore.)





Here are some ways to practice your foreign language or English skills during the summer. Email us your ideas too!

1. Watch a simple television program on Netflix or Amazon Prime and select the language and/or closed captions in another language. Note: I recently met a Japanese-American woman who is trying to learn Spanish. She told me that she watches a program in Japanese and turns on the Spanish subtitles. What an interesting idea!
2. See if your local public library subscribes to DuoLingo or Mango, two wonderful e-learning resources for multiple language learning.
3. Free from Annenberg, watch Destinos for Spanish or French in Action. These are "soap-opera" like television programs for grades 9-12 that help with learning Spanish or French.

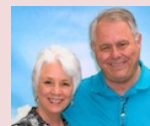
