


With 117 participating institutions, including libraries, archives, and other cultural institutions around the world, the New York Academy of Medicine is sharing free coloring sheets from these collections.

Searchable by author, book, genres, collection or readability, each entry includes an abstract, a citation, the playing time and the word count. Each reading passage can also be downloaded as a PDF to accompany the MP3 version.

The genres include adventure, epic, essay, fable, fairy tale, gothic, history, horror, memoir, satire, science fiction, speech, and many more. The authors range from Aristotle to Jane Austen, Poe, Shakespeare, and more.


