Are you searching for a book, an eBook, or DVD at a local library on a specific topic? Try using our WorldCat label on Infotopia. Here's how it works:

- 1. Enter your search term on Infotopia. Press enter or search.
- 2. Click on the label "WorldCat" at the top of the results.
- 3. Scroll past the line separating the ads from the search results.
- 4. Click on the first result and you will find titles related to your search topic.
- 5. Click on "Find a library" under the WorldCat search box and type in your zip code.
- 6. You may have to re-enter the search term.
- 7. If there are no libraries close to you, it will list all available libraries.
- 8. Don't forget--you should be able to check out the book via inter-library loan at your local public library.
- 9. Once you are on WorldCat, you can customize your search by searching for images, DVDs, websites, music, and more.
- 10. You may be able to check out eBooks via Overdrive using your local public library card.
- 11. Try your search with the search term "Rembrandt" to see how it works.

(Note: You can always send us an email with questions or check with your local librarian for help.)
