Have your students investigated our primary sources web page yet? Find primary documents, videos, images, and recordings from history for the United States, New Zealand, and Australia, as well as individual U.S. states.

Primary sources are the raw materials of history—original documents or objects that were created at the time of an event. Secondary sources retell or analyze historical events. It can be very interesting to analyze primary sources and compare them to several secondary sources!

Some of our recommendations include the following:

Explore the **New York Public Library Digital Collection** of nearly 750,000 digitized items, including prints, photographs, maps, manuscripts, streaming video, and more.
