Find primary documents, videos, images and recordings from history for the United States, New Zealand and Australia, as well as individual U.S. States. **Primary sources** are the raw materials of history—original documents or objects that were created at the time of an event. **Secondary sources** retell or analyze historical events. It can be very interesting to analyze primary sources and compare them to several secondary sources!

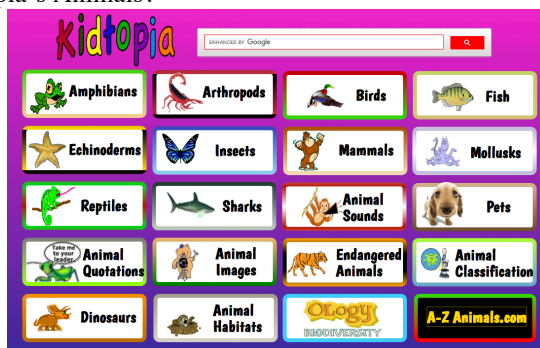
