



## What Should We Do about ChatGPT and other Generative AI Programs?

Stephen Noonoo, in a fascinating article on Edutopia.org (see link above) discusses how schools might set ground rules for using ChatGPT in schoolwork. He suggests three options that schools might choose:

1. Ban the use of ChatGPT entirely.
2. Permit the use of ChatGPT, but be sure that the source is cited just as any other resource.
3. Permit the use of ChatGPT for certain activities such as brainstorming and outlining.

He also discusses the future uses of AI programs in helping students to develop and learn about their own writing.

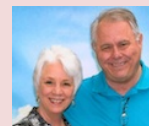
