From concept maps, to flash cards to Pictionary, Daniel Leonard recommends a number of activities that help students easily remember what they have learned. Some of his suggestions include the following:

- Flashcards
- Quick quizzes
- Highlighting
- Write everything learned in one class
- Draw a picture or a sketch
- Play jeopardy
- Use divergent hexagons
- Teach someone else
- Revise class notes
- Play charades
- Stop and jot
- Write you own quiz

For each suggestion, he gives a full summation of how to use these activities to help students improve their learning. Which ones work best for your students?
