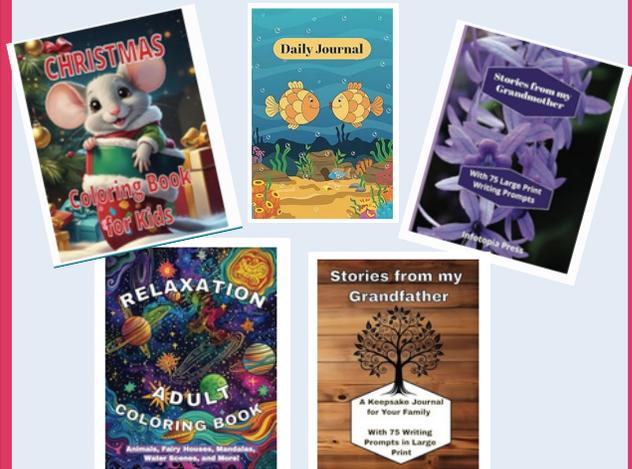

Have you tried **Kidtopia Facts** (kidtopiafacts.com) or **Kidtopia** (kidtopia.info) yet?

Actually, **Kidtopia Facts** just sticks to the facts and is a bit more basic than **Kidtopia**. Both are designed for very young students--ages 4 or 5 and up. Try them out and send us some feedback via email.

Have your students perform a simple search with one word such as elephant. I did a search for "elephant" and only got 3 pages of results. (Google obtained 31 pages of results.) This is an easy way for students to start learning to do research. What do you think of the results?
